Plums and Cherries are just beginning to bloom. Their fragile blooms require calm weather for peak viewing now through the end of April. Dogwoods are a staple in Oregon. These beauties can be seen blooming near the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial beginning in mid-May.

Maples will begin to unfurl their long flower chains in late-April. These are stunning intricate blooms that are often overlooked.

May

Magnolias begin blooming as early as mid-April with M. stellata and will last until the end of May. The peak bloom time should be early May.



Spring Blooms Abound The signs of spring are upon us and rumors of magnolia blooms abound. Many visitors are asking about the status of the Hoyt Magnolia collection and when the peak viewing time will be. The first of our magnolias to bloom and a common sight around Portland is the small tree

Magnolia stellata, at the Hoyt Arboretum

M. stellata has been in cultivation for hundreds of years in Japan and was first introduced in the US in 1861 by George Hall. Today, there are about 8

form of Magnolia stellata, Star Magnolia.

George Hall. Today, there are about 8 common cultivars, though 20 or more exist. Most often seen is Royal Star, an early, profusely blooming white tepaled (petaled) selection.

Common cultivars are 'Jane Platt,' 'Rubra,' 'Waterlily,' 'Rosea,' 'Centennial,' 'Pink Stardust,' and 'Chrysanthemiflora.' Additional cultivars exist but are often not significantly different from this group. Grown for its early bloom time, this Magnolia is a reliable and exuberant bloomer in good moist soil. A sunny location will increase bloom and summer water is important for all magnolias. Bloom color on some cultivars is more pink and tepal numbers can range from 12 to 32 in a single flower. In all cases, this is a small finely branched tree reaching about 15 feet in height.

Though the cultivars of this magnolia are plentiful and common, the species itself has been given the endangered status of "vulnerable" on the Botanic Garden Conservation International Red List. Native to Japan, the population is scattered and under threat from land development and illegal collection. *Ex situ* conservation practices (off-site conservation) carried out at Hoyt Arboretum and other public gardens will ensure this species is protected. Hoyt Arboretum's Magnolia collection is nationally recognized as part of the North American Plant Collections Consortium's multi site Magnolia collection. Come and see the Magnolia stellata species and cultivars today!
